Byron needs no introduction, but here are his particulars for your review:

Byron R. Wien is a Managing Director and the Senior Investment Strategist for the United States at Morgan Stanley. He was a portfolio manager for twenty years prior to joining the firm in January 1985 and he became a managing director later that year. Byron received his A.B. with honors from Harvard College and his M.B.A. with distinction from Harvard Business School.

Byron is a director of Soros Fund Management and is a member of the Investment Committees of Lincoln Center and the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. He is a trustee of the New York Historical Society and Pritzker Foundation. He is the Vice Chairman of The Manhattan Institute and he is a board member and head of the Strategic Planning Committee of Phoenix House. At Harvard, he is on the Executive Committee of the Overseers' Committee on University Resources as well as the Financial Aid Task Force. He is a past president and chairman of the Harvard Business School Club of Greater New York.

In 1995 he co-authored a book with George Soros on the legendary investor's life and philosophy. In 1998 he was named by First Call as the most widely read analyst on Wall Street and in 2000 was ranked the No. 1 strategist by SmartMoney.com based on his market calls during the year.
