Biography:

Eric Mindich is CEO of Eton Park, a global, multi-disciplinary, team-oriented investment organization dedicated to delivering superior risk-adjusted returns over multi-year periods. The firm launched in November 2004, with offices in New York and London, and currently has equity of approximately \$3.5Bn.

Prior to forming Eton Park in 2004, Eric spent 15 years at Goldman Sachs in two main roles: leading the firm's Equities Arbitrage business and managing the firm's Equities Division. Eric joined the firm in 1988 in the Equities Arbitrage Department and ran that department from 1992 until 2000. In 1994, at age 27, he became the youngest partner ever in the history of Goldman Sachs. In 2000, Eric became Co-Chief Operating Officer of the Equities Division and in 2002 became Co-Head of the Equities Division and a member of the Goldman Sachs Management Committee. In 2003, Eric joined the Executive Office as Senior Strategy Officer and Chair of the Firmwide Strategy Committee.

Eric served as a director of the Harvard Management Company from 1996 to 2004. He currently serves as a trustee of The Mount Sinai Medical Center, Inc., as a board member of Lincoln Center Theater, where he serves as chairman of the investment committee, and as a board member of the Whitney Museum of American Art. Eric graduated from Harvard College in 1988 with a BA in Economics, summa cum laude, and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa.
